








Recurrence of Substantiated Child Maltreatment (June 2012 – June 2013)







Number of Child Placement Services Cases (June 2013)




Number of Children in the Legal Custody of DFCS (June 2013)




Children in the Legal Custody of DFCS Under the Age of 18 (June 2012 - June 2013)




Length of Time to Reunification (June 2012 - June 2013)


Def: Percentage of children who exited care during the month through reunification with their family that reunified in less than 12 months from the date of their last removal.



Comparison of Foster Care Entries and Exits (June 2012 - June 2013)




Foster Care Re-Entry Rate (June 2012 - June 2013)
